Sacred Heart News

I had the opportunity to view the newly released movie/documentary this past Wednesday called "Jesus Thirsts, the Miracle of the Eucharist" featuring the likes of evangelists Scott Hahn, Chris Stefanick, and several others. The film was created and released just before the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

To put the icing of the cake, if you will, it is now publicized that the Blessed Carlos Acutis will receive canonization on July $1^{\rm st}$ in Rome. Carlos loved the mystery behind the Eucharist. Although he was young (the first millennial to be declared a saint), he used his knowledge of technology and cataloged all the Eucharistic miracles which have taken place throughout the history of the church.

Also, in July, thousands will gather in Indianapolis for the Eucharistic Congress. Four major processions of the Blessed Sacrament are currently taking place from the north, from the south, and from sea to shining sea. I am no rocket scientist, but there is a pattern to all of this.

Saints cataloging miracles, feast days of the holy hearts, and movies about the Eucharist do not just happen at the same time for no reason. God is speaking to us through His Son.

St. Bonaventure states in one of his works; "It was divine decree that permitted the soldier to open his sacred side with a lance. This was done so the Church might be formed from the side of Christ as he slept the sleep of death on the cross, and so that the scripture might be fulfilled. The blood and water which poured out at that moment were the price for our salvation." This was the first Eucharistic Miracle.

How could one not believe when the priest or deacon places a drop of water in the chalice that this does not become the same water and blood which flowed from the abyss of Christ's own heart. Unfortunately, two-thirds of Catholics in the United States do not believe in the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

There is a reason Jesus said to come to him as if like a child. A child does not have a cluttered heart. Come to him with eagerness like a child receiving their First Communion, a desire to let God speak to you through the graces of the sacrament. I am a Eucharistic Miracle. I believe, Jesus is there for me, with me, and in me.

Challenge yourself. Will you be the next Eucharistic Miracle?


